Physicians must report pesticide illnesses using one of these methods:

### Additional Requirements for a Work-Related Case of a Pesticide Illness

Physicians must report as stated above and in addition:

Send the Doctor's First Report of Occupational  
Injury or Illness to:

- Employer or insurer within 5 days of first visit
- Local Health Officer within 7 days of first visit
